

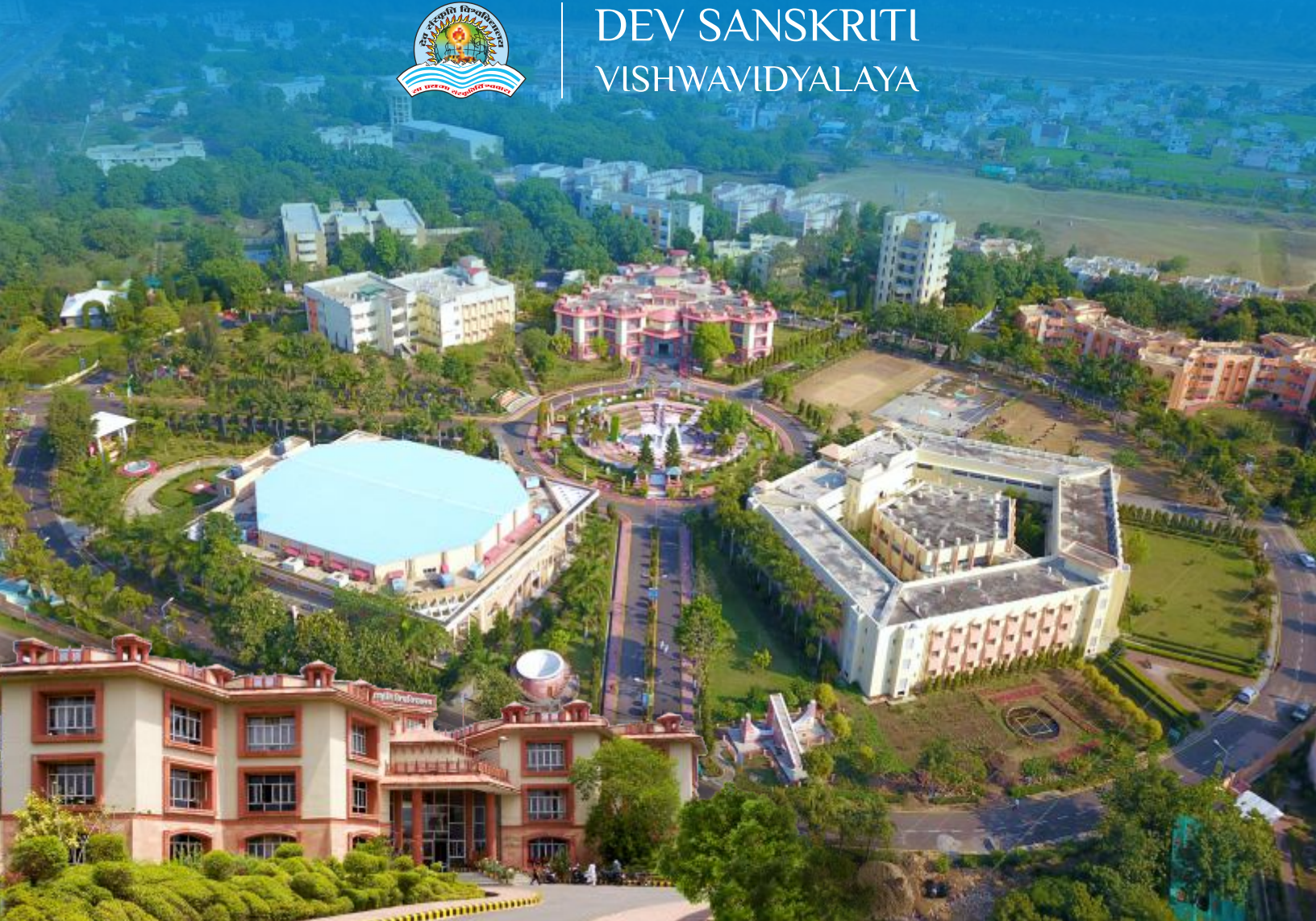

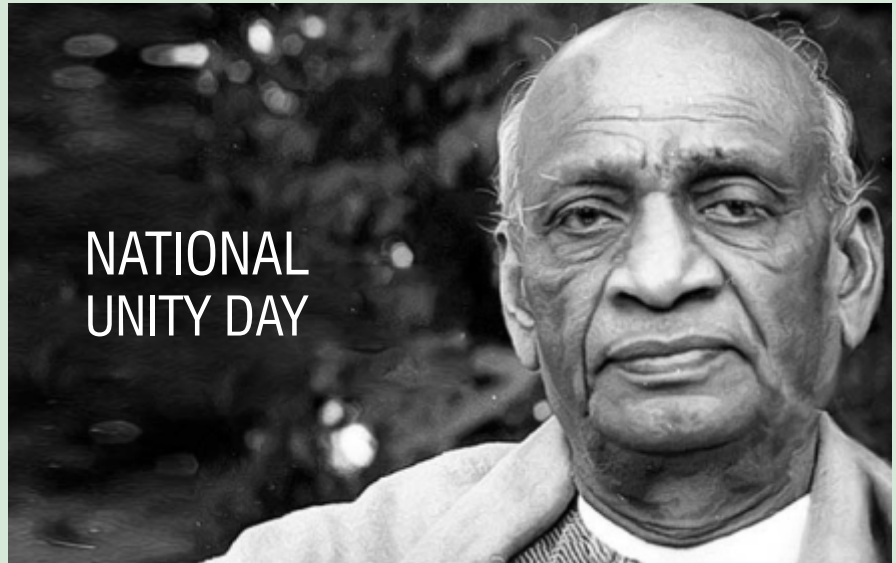

Baldau Devangan Ji gave a speech to the students.

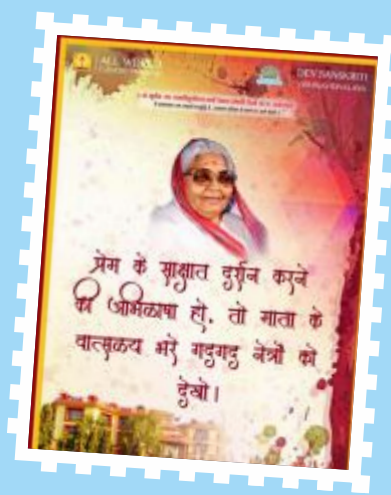
Respected Vice-Chancellor, Shri Sharad Pardhi Ji said that running for unity is more about remembering Sardar Patel, who has been the architect of India's

Bibek Debroy has been a member of NITI Aayog, the think tank of the Government of India. He was awarded the Padma Shri in 2015. He has authored about

110 books in the field of economics, politics and Indology. At the same time, he has also translated many of our great Indian epics and Vedic texts like Mahabharata, Bhagavad Gita, Vedas and Valmiki's Ramayana, Bhagavata Purana (in three volumes), Markandeya Purana (one volume), etc into English. He is the third person ever to achieve this feat, by translating an abridged version of the great Indian epic Mahabharata into English. Greatly influenced by Gurudev's thoughts, he said that it is a matter of good fortune for him to come to the university.

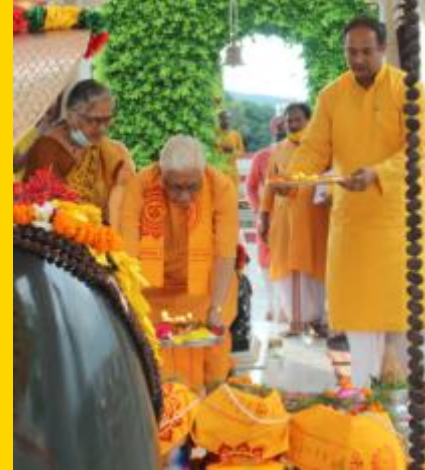


Ganesh Chaturthi

1. Why is upsc the most respected institution in our country?

Because across the globe the impartiality, precision and timeliness of UPSC have always been accepted. It's an exam conducted by an impartial authority, that's something which is – very important because it's a test of your competence, it's a test of your commitment, it's a test of your ability to work long and hard hours of work.

2. What does an administration actually mean?

It's all about incremental changes and about bringing these changes incrementally and consciously. Because it is necessary to know what we are, and what we are trying to be. It's not about becoming a mass leader, it's all about becoming a professional governance expert.

That means when you take this exam you are not a revolutionary, you are not a person who's going to rebel rather you become different from others who are in different professions.

3. What was the need of conducting a UPSC exam in our country?

We felt that those who were in the public sphere felt that a country should be able to produce its own civil servants who would have a complete commitment to their country.

For this, we have to conduct an exam to give an opportunity to the ones who have the ability to be a part of the Indian civil services and desire to serve a nation.

4. What creed/principle did the civil servants have?

The creed/principle is that we will bring about changes within the ambit of the Indian constitution which is the defining force for us, the fountainhead of our existence for us. Because it is through article 311 that all of us get the strength, all of us get the position and all of us get the responsibility to serve the country without fear or favour across political parties across states and across time.

5. When and how did we get the right to conduct examinations in our country?

By 1992, simultaneous examinations were recorded, after the 1935 government of India act it was clear that India was going to be running itself both through the government of India and through the provinces. Before India's independence, the secretary of state wanted to abolish the ICS but Sardar Patel stepped in and insisted that the covenant of the ICS should be shifted from the secretary of the state to governor-general and then the president of India, so in 1947 we had the first exam for the IAS and from then on we have a continuous tradition of having an exam for the civil services.

6. How is today's exam different than it was at that time?

Previously it was only conducted in English but now you can take this exam in any language. As not only that aspirations have grown, we have a diverse range of people to appear for the ICS. Also, the application fees were 100 rupees but at that time it was a big amount so, now the decision was taken that the fees of the ICS exam are reduced from rupees 100 to rupees 25.

7. What were the views of prominent leaders regarding UPSC?

Mahatma Gandhi did not believe in the civil service; he believed that villagers should be impartial and that it should be grassroots democracy.

Dr. Ambedkar on the other hand was totally opposed to panchayats because he felt that the state has to be effective and the state has to be strong, that the Dalits, the minorities and all those who are not part of the political mainstream can also be represented.

Mr. Nehru felt that the bureaucracy in the country should be committed to the political executive.

Sardar Patel, on the other hand, had different views from all others; he felt that the system will be able to run well only if you have an impartial bureaucracy that will be able to resist the day-to-day wishes.

8. What helps one to succeed in this examination? What are three different pods which tell ideals, objectives and duties that the civil servant has to balance?

Working hard with intelligence is what helps one to succeed in this examination. One is, fundamental rights, the second is fundamental duties and the third is, directive principles of state policy.

9. What are the advantages of being a civil servant?

You will get to work at all levels.

Like at the level of Zila panchayat, you will get to work at the level of state government or the government of India and you could also be posted abroad in certain assignments.

It's good for your personal and professional growth and it's good for the growth of the nation.

10. How the civil servant of India is different from the other countries?

Civil servants of India could work for two or three state governments, will work for the union government, will conduct elections throughout the country, and will be covering the entire length and breadth of the country.

11. What are the different things that a UPSC aspirant needs to understand?

- (1) It is not the examination of your competence in a particular field, it is an exam of your ability to relate concepts to practice.
- (2) We spent a lot of time preparing for the exam but we do not write what we have learned in this examination, so prepare your own notes because it gives you the inner strength to take this exam.
- (3) Read extensively both the general studies, most of the newspapers that you can scan.

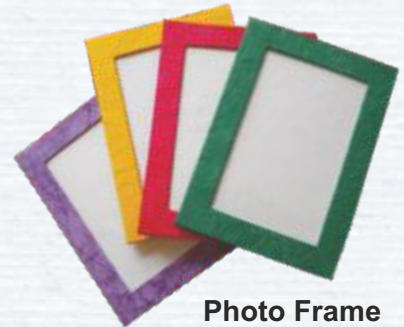
